

# Buford complex “absent anterior Labrum”

- Consists of an **absent antero-superior part of the labrum** in combination with a **Thick “cord-like” middle glenohumeral ligament**.
- This occurs in approximately 1.5% of patients and can be confused with a labral tear.
- However the absent labrum occurs in the superior-anterior quadrant which is an uncommon site of labral tear
